

Birla College organizes 'Shanti Yatra' on Gandhi Jayanti

The Centre for Gandhi Studies, aided by the University Grants Commission of B.K. Birla College, Kalyan, organized a peace march on 2nd October International Day of Non-Violence – the birth anniversary of the Father of the Nation, Mahatma Gandhi. The participants enjoyed the workshop and prepared innovative wall hangings using waste material.






Day 5: Workshop on Greeting card making
