In December 2017, the Cabinet Committee on Security cleared the India-based Neutrino Observatory project, to be built at an investment of Rs 1,500 crore. It is the latest in a series of neutrino detectors, neutrino factories and experiments being set up worldwide to promote research in particle physics. It is an underground project and will comprise a complex of caverns. Neutrinos are the smallest particles that form the universe. To upgrade students with latest Astronomies, DBT-Star Status, Science Association organised a talk on 'Going Underground to look at the sky'.

The Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar Awardee (2013 in Physics) Prof. Amol Digree Department of Theoretical Physics, Tata Institute of Fundamental Research, Mumba was invited under the to deliver a talk on 11th February Dr. Amol Dighe has done pioneering work in the understanding of Neutrino oscillations in extremely derso media like supernova core and in the elucidation of non-linear effects therein.

Prof. Ashok Pradhan, Member, Governing Council, B.K. Birla College, also graced the occasion as the teacher of the eminent scientist and as the teading force for development of scientific aptitude in students.




